



Instructions for Poster Preparation:

Poster session is made to present your research in a different way than oral presentation. Different rules are expected to be followed and are listed here:

1. Whether you are advanced or not in your research, it is possible to submit a poster by following the provided template. The structure should be:

Title	Arial 60Pts
Authors' names and affiliations	Arial 40Pts
Section Heading	Arial 55Pts Bold
Text size	Arial 32Pts

Three sections can be moved / changed to present your research. Suggested sections:

Part 1: Introduction / Context / Literature / Objectives

Part 2:

2.1 Problem definition

2.2 Methodology

2.3 Results

Part 3: Analysis - Conclusion

2. Posters should be prepared directly onto A0 sheets - 841 mm wide by 1189 mm high - or at least onto large (A1 or A2) sheets. Posters made by taping together A4 or quarto sheets tend to look amateurish.
3. For clarity, use lots of diagrams, lots of colour, and not too many words. Be concise.
4. Use phrases and short sentences in "bullet points".
5. The rules for the preparation of good slides apply equally to the preparation of good posters:
 - keep them simple
 - avoid overcrowding and excessive information
 - use large lettering and thick lines
 - "one picture is worth a thousand words"
6. Posters are to be attached to the poster room walls using reusable tack ("blutac" or similar) which will be supplied, and not by thumb tacks (drawing pins) or adhesive tape.
